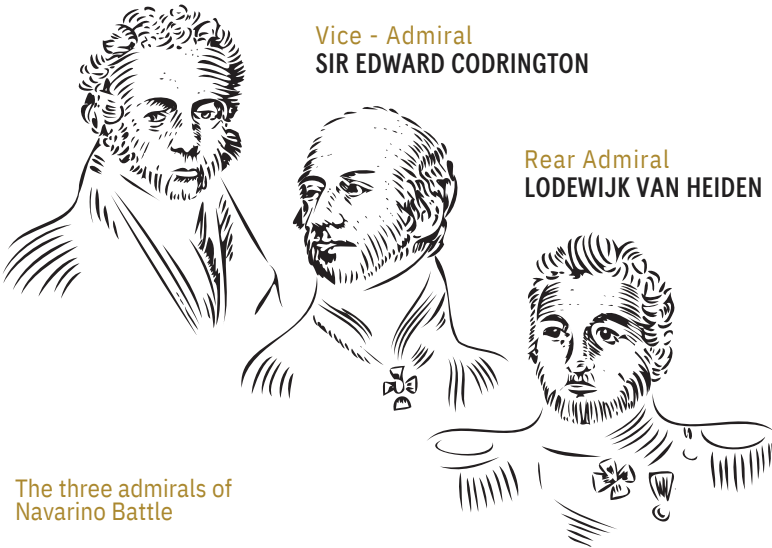
The Battle of Navarino fought on October 20, 1827, in the Ionian Sea, marked a crucial turning point in the Greek War of Independence against the Ottoman Empire.

This historic naval engagement involved a complex web of political interests and alliances, leading to one of the most significant clashes of the early 19th century.

The Greek War of Independence, which began in 1821, sought to liberate Greece from nearly four centuries of Ottoman rule. By 1827, the conflict had escalated into a full-scale war, drawing the attention of major European powers. Russia, France, and Britain, despite their own rivalries, shared a common interest in weakening the Ottoman Empire.

Through diplomatic efforts, a combined British, French, and Russian fleet, known as the Allied Fleet, was dispatched to the eastern Mediterranean under the command of Admiral Edward Codrington. The aftermath of Navarino was significant. It led to the eventual recognition of Greek independence by the Great Powers and the signing of the Treaty of London in 1830, establishing Greece as an independent nation.

The battle's impact reverberated across Europe, marking a shift in the balance of power in the Mediterranean and demonstrating the growing influence of naval firepower in modern warfare.
