Dream Rooms: Environments by Women Artists 1950 - Now

## 2025 National Day Fireworks Display

A fireworks display will be held over Victoria Harbour on 1 October to celebrate the 76th anniversary of the founding of the People's Republic of China. The display lasts approximately 23 minutes and the display will consist of eight segments featuring over 30,000 firework shells.

#### Moon Fest Lumiere

Over 800 traditional Chinese lanterns, including goldfish-shaped designs, will light up Lee Tung Avenue. The lively goldfish lanterns, with their petal-like tails swaying in the gentle breeze, symbolise abundance and joyful reunion, adding a touch of poetry to the bustling streets of Wan Chai. On the day of the Mid-Autumn Festival (6 October 2025), Lee Tung Avenue will present the much-anticipated spectacle — the legendary LED Fire Dragon Fiesta. An 18-metre-long LED dragon replaces traditional incense with colourful LED bulbs. Accompanied by LED lions and a drum ensemble, the dancing dragon reinterprets one of Hong Kong's best-known intangible cultural heritage traditions.
